Dr. Zinsser writes: "P. worked in Dr. Mueller's dept. while here on purification of antigenic substances, and did fairly good work as far as we could judge. There

was great difficulty in communication with P. because of his defective knowledge of the English language and our unfortunate ignorance of Polish. It did not seem to me, however, that his ideas were espec. clear or that his gen'l accomplishments were quite equal to those of some of the other men. It is not impossible that a good deal of this was accounted for by his difficulties with the language. Incidentally, however, it was not easy to get him to put in a full lab. day. Unless his late appearance and early disappearance can be accounted for by outside work, I would say that he did not make the most of his opportunities in this lab."
