4/7/32 GKS' Diary: Discussed with M his work in England and program for Continent. Has engaged in studying sewage disposal and espec. activated sludge, milk supplies from lab. as well as production and distribution points of view and spent some time in experimental station for water softening and clarification of Paterson Engineering Co. Sir Alex. Houston was espec. kind and helpful to M. Before leaving London at end of month M. will work with Wilson on bacteriology of water examination. May and June will be devoted to special work in Brussels, Holland, Germany, Hungary and Yugoslavia. M has taken movies of everything he has seen so he should have an interesting documentation for use in Spain.
