Gentlemen

At the request of our Trustees I submit the enclosed statements of the work of The People's Institute together with a request for the renewal of the generous gift which for the past 19 years has been made to the Institute through the kindness of Mr. Rockefeller.

May I outline the present activities of the Institute in the following way?

1. Educational Work

A. The Cooper Union Forum Tuesday and Friday Evenings
Great Hall of Cooper Union
Everett Dean Martin, Director

The work of the Forum during the past year has been a campaign against cheap propaganda, such as is practised on the people on all sides by unscrupulous leaders. Mr. Martin has adhered to the belief that the function of the Forum at Cooper Union is to assist the individual toward sane thinking. He has made the Forum an important educational institution in New York City, wholly free from the spirit of any cult or propaganda, and has succeeded in holding the intense interest of audiences averaging upward of 1200.

There is no doubt that the Cooper Union Forum has done very much during the past year to open the eyes of restless groups who do not entirely understand American ideals to the dangers of revolutionary propaganda as presented to them by unscrupulous agitators. The aggregate of the audiences for the past winter has been 75,000 people.

Mr. Martin's recent book "The Behavior of Crowds" is based on his lectures at Cooper Union two winters ago.

This series is a winter continuation of the spirit of the Stadium Concerts. The Hall has been filled to overflowing for every concert and the greatest appreciation has been shown by the public for musical opportunities of very high standard.

B. Stadium Concerts City College Stadium
Every Evening
July and August

The Stadium Concerts are a gift to New York City by lovers of music who hope to see the enjoyment of music a larger part of our civic life as it is in the cities of Europe.

C. Community Music Organization

The Music League maintains an organizer whose duty is to assist districts to cooperate musically and to get the best results for the individuals in whose interest they are working. With our assistance the Gramercy neighborhood has organized a strong committee which is known as the Gramercy Music Committee. Miss Susan Myers, Chairman.

Contribution of \$1,000 assumed by the Memorial the last two years.

This organization conducts certain lines of educational, musical and community work in the city, making it a point to turn over to the city authorities or to others the continuation and development of the work once established. It has, however, continued for some years the Cooper Union Forum and the Music League. This Forum is conducted on Tuesday and Friday evenings with attendance averaging over 1,200. It discusses matters of vital interest to the people. The Music League conducts the Institute concerts on Sunday evenings at Cooper Union which are attended by full houses; it cooperates with the Stadium Concerts conducted during the summer at the Lewisohn Stadium at City College; it also provides an organizer for community music and has developed several centers in connection with the school houses.

The Institute also conducts a School of Philosophy, an educational movement which grows out of the Forum meetings. This is partly financed by the students themselves. It conducts the Gramercy Boys Club at Public School No. 40, beginning in the way of serving the boys of the poorer districts through the school houses with their gymnasiums and other opportunities.

Recently it has developed the handicraft work in the service of foreign groups of women, chiefly Ukrainians; the headquarters are at the Ukrainian Settlement on East Sixth Street.

It appears that the conduct of the work is still good and that the attendance and interest keeps up to the standard.

The comparison between these three sets of figures is difficult. It seems, however, that the contributions during the past year have not been as large as they were in 1919, though those of 1919 were nearly \$10,000 larger than those of 1918. The income from operations which is perhaps a good sign has increased greatly during the last two years. The expenditure increase in line of administration for the year ending June 30, 1920, is largely due to the item of salaries.

It is evident that a large number of smaller contributors support the work and that the larger ones include Colonel Du Pont, who gave \$6,500 in 1920, Mr. Sanderson, the Director, who gave \$6,750, Mr. Frothingham who gave \$5,000, Mr. Baldwin and Mr. Macy, who gave \$1,500 each, and several donors of \$1,000, besides the Laura Spelman Rockefeller Memorial.

I suggest a renewal of the contribution of \$1,000.

It is laying the foundation for a wider development of Textile Art in this country.

Ukrainian Needlecraft Guild.

The object of the Ukrainian Needlecraft Guild is to assist Ukrainian women to contribute to America the beauty of their folk art as expressed in the fine native designs of their needlecraft. By recognizing and accepting the Ukraine's contribution to our national art, effective help is being given to this foreign group toward becoming more thoroughly American. The Guild adapts their designs for American use and finds a market for them. This unit is one of the local foreign groups working with the Guild of the Needle and Bobbin Crafts.

Community Center Work. Headquarters,
70 Fifth Avenue. Program for 1921-1922.
The development of Community activities in the section of the city between 9th Ave. and the river and from 40th to 50th Streets. The Board of Education, Strykers Lane and Neighborhood organizations are co-operating. In co-operation with the Community Center Department of the Board of Education, this committee is working toward an adequate appropriation by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment for Community Center activities in Public Schools. The method is to establish demonstration activities where they are most needed to show what can and should be done in every section of the city.

Children's Choruses. Headquarters,
70 Fifth Avenue. This work is done in co-operation with the various settlements. The program for 1922 includes Children's Choruses in co-operation with the Hudson Guild, Lenox Hill Settlement, and other centers as fast as the funds permit.

Dear Sirs:

May I send for your files the enclosed outline of the work of the People's Institute for the year 1932 together with various pamphlets and reports of our work which may be of interest to you?

The work of the Institute has shown marked vigor and growth in the past two years and the record of contributions to our activities reflects this:

Considering the general financial situation of recent years I am sure you will agree that such a record speaks well for the quality of our work which continues to merit the increasing confidence and support of New York City.

The general public reached and influenced by the People's Institute is steadily growing. This is due in part to a changed policy begun four years ago by Mr. Martin, Director of the Cooper Union Forum, when he made the Cooper Union Forum primarily educational and started series of lectures dealing with social and psychological subjects of special interest to these audiences. How he handles these lectures, and why they are a unique service in public life deserves the attention of every member of your Board.

We believe a report of this work made personally by one of your directors would be of great interest to you. Twelve hundred to fifteen hundred men (there are almost no women) gather twice a week for these lectures. There is no question that through such audiences the People's Institute is exerting a wide influence.

Out of the lectures at Cooper Union have grown the People's Institute Extension Classes, conducted by Mr. Martin at the Manhattan Trade School three or four nights a week. They began four years ago with one small class made up of men who were enthusiastic over the quality of Mr. Martin's work at the Cooper Union Forum. The attendance now numbers upward of 100 for every class. These classes constitute a small college in which university professors are giving regular courses in university subjects. With more funds they could be developed into an extremely interesting and significant educational institution on the East Side where such a college is very much needed.

The People's Institute Concerts given every Sunday evening in the Great Hall of Cooper Union are now

an established part of New York's civic life and they are going far toward creating a new musical center of high standard in the southern part of the city, where for many years there has been no music. Such artists as Madame Elly Ney, Germaine Schnitzer, Sophie Braslau, Rafaelo Diaz, Olga Carrara, and such selections as Beethoven's Fifth, Tchaikowsky's Fifth and Brahms' First Symphonies bear witness to the high standard maintained. The orchestra is brilliantly conducted by Mr. Dirk Foch and thousands are turned away on the evenings when symphonic programs are given. Nowhere in New York is there a more responsive and spontaneous audience than the one that assembles every Sunday evening in Cooper Union. The response never fails to record an approval of musical values which is entirely genuine and highly discriminating. The People's Institute Concerts are carrying forward the spirit of the Stadium Concerts and by using the American Orchestral Society are assisting the movement to give American students who have reached a professional standard in their music, a chance for professional orchestral appearances. The orchestra is composed of 40 professional musicians and 60 students.

The Stadium Concerts are I think well known to your Board. Next summer will be the fourth season of this fine civic work of the People's Institute. The concerts are given nightly for a season of six to eight weeks, according to the funds available, and New York's finest orchestras under the leadership of such conductors as Rothwell, Hadley and Herbert have done very much to increase the content of

summer life in New York during the hot summer months of July and August. 50,000 free tickets are distributed through accredited New York musical and philanthropical centers such as the Music School Settlements, Y.W.C.A., Hospitals, Association for the Blind, Seamen's Church Institute, Knights of Columbus, etc. As a corollary to this work a Children's Chorus for a group of 3,000 children was arranged and conducted last summer in cooperation with the Hudson Guild. The children assembled in Chelsea Park at 28th Street and 10th Avenue. The Institute has pledged itself to continue this chorus for the summer of 1932 and to start a new chorus at the Lenox Hill Settlement. This work will be enlarged as our funds permit.

The work of the People's Institute with the Guild of the Needle and Bobbin Crafts is cooperative only, the Institute contributing the services and salary of Miss McDowell who is the active organizer of the Guild. The Guild as you no doubt know, is the financial promoting agency which is furthering the interests and guiding the artistic development of various groups such as the Scuola d'Industrie Italiane, the Aquidneck Cottage Industries, the Bohemian Arts and Crafts of Lenox Hill, Italian Needlework Guild of Hamilton House, and the Ukrainian Needlecraft Guild of the Ukrainian quarter. One of these groups is actively sponsored by the Institute, the Ukrainian Needlecraft Guild, for the initial work of which we raised many thousands of dollars and toward which we now pledge the salary of their director, Miss Freeman, until the work is self supporting.

A very active period of Community Center Work has just closed for the Institute. Over a period of two years we were at work in the Gramercy neighborhood. This work has now become a part of the neighborhood activities through the formation of the Gramercy Boy's Club and the Gramercy Music Committee. The Institute bore the financial burden of this work until it became self supporting.

We are now transferring our organizing efforts to assist the Public School and the Strykers Lane Community House in the section of the west side lying between 9th Avenue and the river and 40th and 50th Streets.

Our trustees have asked me to make formal application to your Board for an increased gift toward our work for 1922 which we are confident investigation will show to be deserving of such an increase. We hope you will consider making your gift \$5,000, which would be a great assistance to us and yet would not represent an undue proportion of the minimum fund which we must raise. In any event would it be permissible for us to ask that your gift to us be fixed for a stated date, preferably in February, in order that our finance committee may know wherever it is possible what funds will be available for our work for each month? I am sure you will readily understand how important this information is to us.

The long continued support and interest of your Board is one of the finest and most appreciated expressions of approval which we receive from New York City. A closer examination of our work will show that we have merited this trust, and because we are so sure we are carrying forward a difficult and necessary work and at the same time adhering

to the best standards of progress and of tradition,
we venture to ask for your increased support.

This Institute has long been active in educational, musical, and recreational interests in this city. It had begun in connection with the Public Schools and at Cooper Union. More recently it has emphasized educational and musical work at Cooper Union. The last few years have developed considerable interest in civic, economic, and philisophical courses of lectures at Cooper Union. These have been largely attended. In addition there is a Class of Philosophy conducted by Mr. Martin who has charge of the educational features in general. It would appear from all the facts we can gather that these lectures and classes are both popular and useful.

The musical activities for the year just passed are evidenced in the concerts in Cooper Union on Sundays, fifteen of which are held each winter, in the Children's Chorus, and in the general effort to further musical interests in the Public Schools. Besides these is a larger musical undertaking, the Stadium Concerts, furthered by Mr. Adolph Lewisohn chiefly, and by many others. This undertaking is not purely a work of the People's Institute, though it gets considerable credit for its activities in behalf of the Stadium Concerts.

The Institute is furthering handicraft work for women, and has centered its effort in the Ukrainian group. It also assists to a degree the Guild of Needle and Bobbin crafts which is in part a separate undertaking. In charge of both of these is a Miss MacDowell who is very competent. These handicraft undertaking during the past year have taken in in contributions and sales about \$30,000. and expended about \$29,000.

The social activities of the Institute center in Public School No. 40, where they continue to do a recreational, boys club, and musical work.

CONCLUSION AND

RECOMMENDATION: The activities of the Institute for the year 1921 were

apparently just the same as those of 1920. The attendance upon its meetings, with the exception of the Stadium Concerts, was somewhat larger in 1921.

The receipts from the handicraft work were considerably larger, indicating a larger work. It is to be noticed that the contributions are less in 1921 than in 1920 by \$8,832. This is partially due to the fact that Mr. Sanderson and some other large supporters were in 1921 unable to give as largely as before. It is to be noted that the total receipts are about \$13,000 larger, due entirely to the increased receipts in the handicraft work.

In response to the request that we increase to \$5,000, I am inclined to recommend only a renewal of the \$1,000 appropriation, and suggest a careful study of the work some time during the coming year.

Dear Sirs:

Attention Mr. W. S. Richardson.

As Chairman of its Board of Trustees, I am writing this letter to request that you investigate the work of The People's Institute with a view to an increased contribution to the support of its educational activities. I understand that such a request was made last year by Mr. Herbert L. Satterlee.

For eighteen years Mr. Rockefeller personally contributed to our work and since 1919, the annual contribution of \$1,000 has come to us through The Laura Spelman Rockefeller Memorial. This generous and long continued assistance is very gratifying to the Trustees of The People's Institute and encourages me in the belief that a special investigation and study of the methods and opportunities of our work in adult education would interest you and would lead to such additional aid to us as would enable us to take advantage of opportunities for greater service which the Institute is, I believe, especially fitted to perform.

Your record will show that during the twenty-five years of its existence, The People's Institute has been the initiator of a large number of public services, many of which have

reached the stage of independent financial support. The Institute is at the present time concentrating all its efforts upon the task of adult education. During the season just closed, we reached total audiences of about eighty-six thousand people. I am sending a number of the printed programs of these courses of lectures which will show you the character of the work done. The Institute has maintained the highest standards of intellectual and social responsibility in its work and has, at the same time, been able to enlist the confidence and receive a very generous and sympathetic response from those who attend its meetings and classes. There is much interest at the present time in labor and adult education and there is a growing desire on the part of the public for adult educational opportunities. This desire has frequently been met by irresponsible groups whose so-called educational activities are hardly anything more than a thin and superficial veil, covering various forms of propaganda and fadism.

When you consider the large number of persons who regularly attend our meetings and classes, and compare our overhead cost with that of other organizations engaged in similar work, I think you will find that we are able to give very valuable and significant instruction to a pretty large group, who both for their own sake and that of the

community need it, and all at a very small per capita cost. Our task is peculiar and the method and spirit of our approach to it have been worked out through years of experience in the task itself. It is these aims and methods and the possibilities of wider usefulness through more adequate financial support that I trust you will investigate.

I particularly want to request that you visit one of Mr. Martin's lectures at Cooper Union on Friday night, so that you may see for yourself the character of the work he is doing and of the response he is receiving. Persons who have for years been familiar with our activities at Cooper Union, and who are competent to judge of these matters, are constantly telling us that they note a quality in the spirit of our audiences at Cooper Union which differentiate them from other popular audiences. There is a keen intellectual interest, a rather surprising lack of bitterness and partisanship, a growing feeling of tolerance.

With adequate financial assistance, it will easily be possible for the Institute to increase the number of its evening classes and their attendance to a point where its influence on public opinion is very greatly augmented. We believe that it is necessary that this sort of work be done and that it ought to be done on such a scale and in such a way that the effort for enlightened public opinion reach a maximum number of those

who are now looking for just this sort of leadership.

Referring to our recent conversation about the People's Institute, I am sending you herewith some comparative statements showing the Institute's financial condition this year as compared with last year.

1. A statement comparing receipts of the general fund for last year and for this year.
2. A statement of the disbursements of the general fund for this year and for last year.
3. A statement showing receipts and disbursements of the so-called school fund for this year and for last year.
4. A list of the principal contributors ^{*to the General Fund*} for this year and for last year.

You already have a statement of receipts and disbursements ^{*of the Institute*} for the calendar year ending December 31, 1922.

In the statements I am sending you today I have excluded all receipts and disbursements for other than educational purposes and I have also excluded the receipts and disbursements for the concerts which we gave at Cooper Union last year.

The concerts which we gave this year were not financed by the Institute so to include them would confuse the comparison between this year and last.

I notice in these statements that the school fund which is run through a separate bank account does not absolutely tie-in with the general fund. This comes from the fact that the general fund made some payments to the school fund direct and made some payments of bills on its account which are included in the column "Institute School."

I believe all of the big contributors who have either failed us this year or reduced their subscriptions, are heavy contributors to the Mrs. De Cravotto Symphony Orchestra, and our present financial distress is largely due to that enterprise. If we can be helped for a couple of years I have no doubt that the Institute will get back again on a sound financial basis.

I hope you have been able to get in to hear Mr. Martin lecture and particularly to observe the audience.

Mr. Henry de Forest Baldwin has handed me your letter of March 13th with reference to the finances of the People's Institute and has suggested that as Treasurer of the Institute, I send you a request in the name of the Institute explaining the financial assistance which we feel will be necessary for the next two years. Accordingly, I have had a budget of our requirements carefully made up. This indicates that our requirements for the season 1923-1924 and the season 1924-1925 will be approximately ^{for each season.} \$19,000. This will cover the annual expenses in each of these seasons but it does not allow for any expansion of any activity of our People's Institute school during that time.

A study of the gifts which we have received during the present season indicates that a liberal estimate of what we may expect during each of the next two seasons, would be as follows: \$5,000. in small gifts, \$9,000. from our larger givers, which would be a total of \$14,000.

The Institute therefore needs an additional \$5,000. a year in order to continue its activities on the present basis. This is the assistance that we are hopeful that The Laura Spelman Rockefeller Memorial might be willing to give us.

May I take the opportunity to add this personal word. I have closely followed the work which the Institute is doing and I am convinced that there is no more important activity in the city. The lectures delivered by Mr. Everett Martin are quite remarkable and just the sort of thing that the type of audience that he interests should have delivered to them. The other work is also most useful and important.

We will be glad to give you any additional information which you may think useful.

I have your letter of March 21st, with
reference to the People's Institute.

My talk with Mr. Baldwin took a somewhat
different line from that outlined in your letter. Mr.
Baldwin pointed out to me that several of the larger con-
tributors to the People's Institute had suddenly discon-
tinued their subscriptions, and he felt that if some money
could be provided on a descending sliding scale, over a
period of three or four years, that the Institute would in
the meantime be able to increase the popular constituency
so that the recent losses could be made up.

It may be that after studying the situation
you felt that this program was not a feasible one, but since
you do not mention it in your letter I wondered whether the
possibilities of this method of financing had been consid-
ered. I think, on the whole, it would be more appealing to
our Board than a proposal for an annual subsidy for an in-
definite period, although, of course, as a matter of fact I
am unable to give you any assurance that either proposal
would be favorably acted upon.

Thank you very much for your personal judgment
as to the effectiveness of the work which the Institute is


