  - 4/18/68 RF-WCO: C went to Wisconsin in 1963 financed by an organization called the Eliah Aguja Foundation which is administrated by the Good Samaritans, and this particular fellowship was arranged for by the Instituto Chileno-Norteamericano. This fellowship was good for a year and he continued on at Wisconsin for another year and a half, that is, until January 1966, supported by an OAS fellowship. He took his prelims in October and has been at the Instituto here since his return. C was asked why he had not raised the question of support for his return to Wisconsin earlier and he responded that it is only in the past month that he is sure his dissertation was in condition to be reviewed by his committee should he be able to get to Madison this September. His dissertation is an effort at determining the cost of protection for Chilean economy and from this you can see his major concern is trade. RF was very well impressed with C as an individual and his record at Wisconsin was satisfactory. He had been a law student in Chile before going to Wisconsin and consequently his grades for the first year were largely B's and thereafter were all A's.
